



Anti-Slavery Statement

This statement is made pursuant to s.54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and sets out the steps that Grimme UK Ltd have taken and are continuing to take to ensure that modern slavery or human trafficking is not taking place within their business or supply chain.

Modern slavery is a crime and a violation of fundamental human rights. All types of modern slavery have in common the deprivation of a person's liberty by another in order to exploit them for personal or commercial gain. Modern slavery encompasses slavery, servitude, human trafficking and forced labour. Grimme UK Ltd are fully committed to acting ethically and with transparency and integrity in all of its business dealings and relationships to ensure modern slavery is not taking place in our business or in our supply chains.

Our Policies and Procedures

As part of our commitment to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains, we have the following internal procedures to ensure that it is conducting business in an ethical and transparent manner:

Supply Chain

As part of our supply chain process we are looking to incorporate a review of controls undertaken by a selection of suppliers to ensure that there is no evidence of slavery or human trafficking. We will not support or deal with any business involved in slavery or human trafficking. This process will be finalised and will begin during 2019 as we aim to make improvements on our processes.

Recruitment & Employment

We conduct robust checks on new employees including eligibility to work in the UK. We attempt to safeguard individuals from being forced to work against their will.

We comply with minimum and living wage legislation.

Responsibility For The Policy

The management of Grimme UK Ltd has overall responsibility for ensuring this policy complies with our legal and ethical obligations and that all our people comply with it. The policy applies to persons working for us on our behalf in any capacity, including employees, directors, officers, agency workers, seconded workers, apprentices, agents, contractors, external consultants, third-party representatives and business partners.

Any concerns regarding modern slavery should be reported to management. We encourage openness and will support anyone who raises a genuine concern in good faith, even if they turn out to be mistaken. We are committed to ensuring no one suffers any detrimental treatment as a result of reporting in good faith any knowledge or suspicion that modern slavery is taking place in any part of the business or its supply chain.
